Arrooo, Arrooo! Beagle Palooza is Coming!



Mark your calendars for **November 1-9, 2025** for our annual Beagle Palooza online auction! Beagle Palooza 2025 runs from 8 am, Saturday, November 1 — 8 pm on Sunday, November 9.

This auction helps us cover medical expenses, provide temporary shelter, feed, and take in more beagles. Before a dog is adopted through Nittany Beagle Rescue, they are spayed/neutered, given needed shots, tested for heartworm and tick-borne diseases, and microchipped. Some dogs need more advanced care and receive surgery for torn ACLs, dental cleanings with extractions, tumor removal, and more. Most dogs get exams prior to adoption. We ensure our rescued beagles' health, happiness and comfort is top priority. For example, neuters can cost \$350+/-, dentals \$800+/-, hernias/mass removal \$550+, ACL repairs \$900+. Donations are crucial to help us continue to provide the best care to the dogs in our rescue. While our adoption fee of \$250 goes towards the vet bill, it seldom covers it all.

On Sunday, November 9, we will start to close out Beagle Palooza with a Dog Walk & S'mores at Founders Pavilion (Pavilion #1) at Greenwood Furnace State Park. The Dog Walk starts at 1:30 pm. About 2:30 pm, we'll build a fire in the fireplace so we can make S'mores and toast marshmallows. We'll also have hot chocolate, warm cider & water and supply the paper products. Bring something to share if you like! Bring yourself and your canine buddy, or just yourself if your 4-legged best friend prefers to stay home. The Dog Walk & S'mores will end about 4 pm since Greenwood Furnace State Park closes at dusk. Everyone will have plenty of time to get home to continue bidding on their favorite items since the online auction doesn't close until 8 pm.

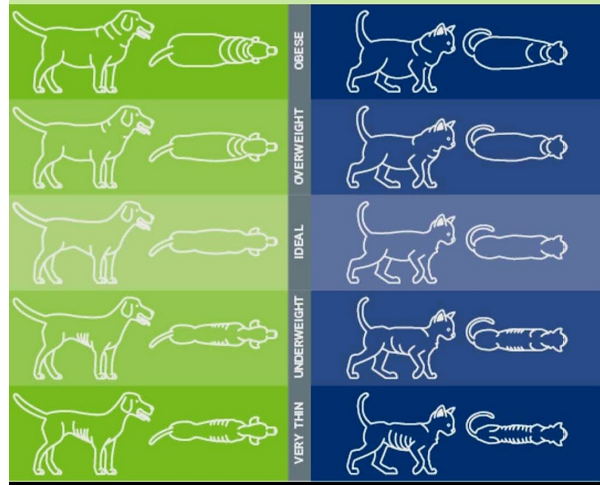
National Pet Obesity Day was earlier this month. Here's a simple chart to give you some idea of how your pet compares to an ideal weight.

- Reduces the risks of injury to bones, joints and muscles that are associated with excess weight.

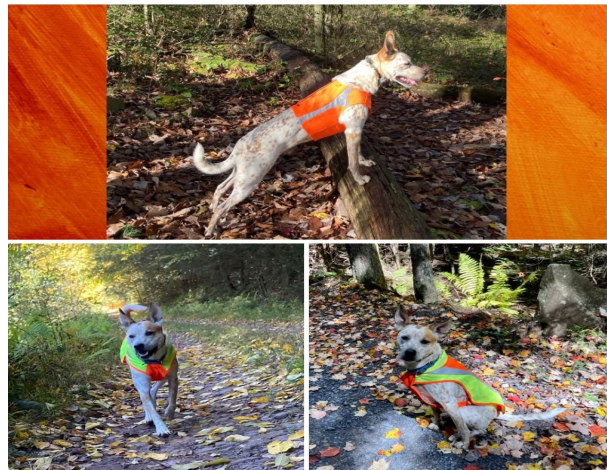

Doggie Treat Translator and Happy Endings

Our doggy treat translator compares the calories and some common human foods and meals with the caloric value of popular dog treats so you can understand how one snack or meal will affect your furry friend.

The chart includes ham, graham crackers, cheese, sausage, and chips so you can get a comprehensive understanding of how different foods interact with your pup's diet.

For a dog, 2 slices of wafer thin ham is the **Human equivalent** of 1 can of Coke.

For a dog, 1 oz. of cheese is the **Human equivalent** of 2.5 hamburgers.

For a dog, 1 graham cracker is the **Human equivalent** of medium fries.

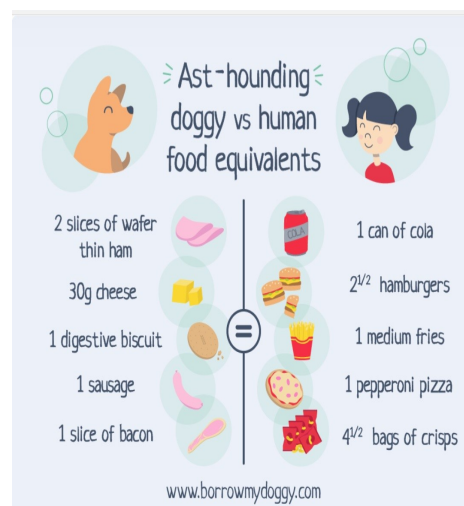
For a dog, 1 slice of toast and butter is the **Human equivalent** of 3 donuts.

For a dog, 1 sausage is the **Human equivalent** of a pepperoni pizza.

For a dog, 1 slice of bacon is the **Human equivalent** of a 4 oz. bag of potato chips.

For a dog, 1 standard biscoff biscuit is the **Human equivalent** of 1.5 cans of coke.

For a dog, 1 standard size bag of potato chips is the **Human equivalent** of 6 hot dogs.



With this info at your fingertips, you can finally be sure that all your pup's snacking is as healthy and nutritious as possible - regardless if it comes from a treat bag or off your own plate.

Now go ahead and enjoy those puppy snuggles without worrying about overindulging them!
